

Requirements for the Certificate in Corporate and Business Law

Requirements:

- **Business Organizations**
- **Three core courses**
- **Three elective courses**
- **One skills and experiential learning component:**
 - **Externship/Field Placement (field placements must be approved by the supervising faculty member and Program Chair)**
 - **A Certificate course that is approved by the Law School for skills credit or**
 - **A Certificate clinic**

All required core courses may count as electives if an applicant has a sufficient number of other core courses. **NO COURSE CAN BE COUNTED MORE THAN ONCE.**

Waiver Policy:

Applicants may apply for a waiver of one of the requirements via email (rllaw.cclg@law.rutgers.edu). Waivers of core courses are rarely granted. For electives, waivers may be granted if an applicant has taken a substitute course that is related to business and corporate law.
